FOREWORD

The Hon'ble Prime Minister of India, Shri Narendra Modi, has expressed a desire to make India drug-free by 2047, the hundredth year of Indian Independence. This has also been seconded emphatically by the Hon'ble Union Home Minister, Shri Amit Shah.

The 3rd Apex level Narco Co-ordination Centre (NCORD) Committee meeting under the Chairmanship of the Hon'ble Union Home Minister was held on 27.12.2021. At this meeting, far reaching decisions had been taken on various Agenda Points related to drug law enforcement in India. And on the topic of capacity building and training, it had been decided that:

“Training and capacity building are important aspects of narcotics control. Separate training modules on drug related offences and procedures may be designed by NCB in co-ordination with DoR and BPR&D for Police, Paramilitary forces and Public Prosecutors. Keeping in view COVID restrictions, online trainings may also be organised”.

In compliance of the decisions taken at the 3rd Apex level NCORD Committee meeting, five sets of training modules have been approved by the Ministry of Home Affairs and circulated to Central Academy for Police Training (CAPT), Bhopal, National Academy of Customs, Indirect Taxes & Narcotics (NACIN), Department of Revenue, Ministry of Finance and Ministry of Social Justice & Empowerment (MoSJ&E) and all States so as to widen the reach of the training curriculum and maximize the number of personnel trained.

I would like to place on record my sincere belief and gratitude for Director, BPR&D and his team who helped NCB in designing the Training Modules on Drug law enforcement. I thank MoSJE to help in the content of awareness modules which became part of the Core training.

At a time when drug law enforcement agencies across the world are witnessing increasing instances of illicit drug trafficking employing sophisticated and new-age technologies like Darknet and Crypto currencies, it is axiomatic that law enforcement officers keep pace with such techniques in a manner analogous to the challenges they are faced with. Training and capacity building in such relevant high technology arenas provide field officers at the very cutting edge of illicit drug interception and confiscation with the tools necessary to target and decimate large and multi-fanged Drug Trafficking Organisations (DTO) and syndicates and in the process eradicate this scourge from wider society as a whole.

It is fervently hoped that the end user specific training modules developed in this instance by the Narcotics Control Bureau, in conjunction with sister agencies, would go a long way in enhancing the capabilities of drug law enforcement agencies and officers spread across the country and facilitate the emergence and sustenance of a drug free India as envisioned by the Hon'ble Prime Minister of India.
